



New Mainstream Water Treatment System Commissioned at Sunset View Beach Saskatchewan

Sunset View Beach, SK—Mainstream is pleased to announce the completion of installation and commissioning of the BioFiltration Municipal based drinking water treatment plant at the Hamlet of Sunset View Beach in the RM of Mervin in North Central Saskatchewan. The community is a Resort Village on the eastern shore of Lake Turtleford, from which it obtains its raw water. The community has previously had hygienic status, with resulting Boiled Water Advisories, poor water quality and limitations placed on the communities' development opportunities.

The new Mainstream drinking water treatment plant employs many environmentally features inherent in the BioFiltration treatment train design. These enable the wastewater production to be minimized and then to be returned to the source lake, thus avoiding lagoon and other infrastructure costs for the community. This is possible as there are no chemicals added to the water during the treatment process.

“We were looking for an environmentally friendly treatment system suited to our communities special needs”, said Mr Larry Olm, a local resident and Utility Board member and who has been involved with the project since its inception. “Its design and features are ideal for our community which has a high peak demand in summer and minor usage throughout the winter months” he said “and the Environmental features are a real positive when dealing with our lakes water” he commented.

The project includes new raw water intake system as well as specially designed treated storage facilities that are a very significant part of the overall Mainstream design.
