Town of Radville

Receives Infrastructure Grant

On Tuesday, September 11th and Weyburn area municipalities received \$1,056,234 in combined federal and provincial funding for six infrastructure projects through the Canada-Saskatchewan Municipal Rural Infrastructure Fund (MRIF).

The investment was announced by Ed Komarnicki, Member of Parliament for Souris-Moose Mountain, on behalf of the Honourable Rona Ambrose, President of the Queen's Privy Council for Canada, Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs and Minister of Western Economic Diversification;

and over \$230,000 for the R.M. of Cymri to reconstruct a road to accommodate heavy oilfield and farm trucks.

Town of Radville Alderman, Ken Bourassa was Master of Ceremonies and introduced the guests. The guests gave brief speeches on behalf of the Governor General of Canada and the Province of Saskatchewan. Radville Mayor, Dave Bellavance also gave a brief

speech as follows: "The total infrastructure investment for the Town of Radville has had an investment of over \$152 million for the installation of a new biofiltration treatment system in its existing water treatment plant. The biofiltration system is an environmentally friendly and cost efficient way to improve the Town's water quality; R.M. of Elcapo - Grid Road Resurfacing, MRIF funding \$103,550, Project Cost \$207,100 for resurfacing the Sakimay Grid Road's clay base. It is expected that the resurfacing will make the road safer for traffic between Sakimay First Nation and Provincial Highway 47; Town of Wawota - Water Main Replacement, MRIF funding \$12,394, Project cost \$25,868 to see the Town of Wawota aging water main lines replaced with new PVC piping. The new lines are expected to end the numerous water breaks that the Town has experienced during the last five years; R.M. of Lomond - Grid Road Construction, MRIF funding \$180,000, Project cost \$360,000 to construct a heavy haul gravel road to service the high volume of oilfield traffic in the area.

Total MRIF funding: \$1,056,234. Total project costs: \$2,112,471.

In attendance for the announcements were representatives from surrounding municipalities who are receiving funds, along with representatives from Mainstream Water Solutions Inc. and Pinter and Associates Environmental Safety and Geotechnical Consultants. The day ended with refreshments and compliments for the Town of Radville.

These projects are an example of how MRIF is supporting a stronger, safer and better province through infrastructure projects that provide cleaner air and water, a stronger economy and a better quality of life for our communities.

The projects in the area receiving funds are: R.M. of Cymri - Road Reconstruction. MRIF funding \$230,412. Project cost \$460,827 for the reconstruction of the road leading to Mainprize Regional Park.

The road is being reconstructed so that it can accommodate heavy haul oilfield and farm trucks; R.M. of Chester - Grid Road Reconstruction. MRIF Funding \$129,654. Project cost \$259,308 for the reconstruction of a grid road to join roads reconstructed in 2006 and 2003. Once completed, it will serve as a grain hauling route to the feedlot and grain terminal located on Grid 616; Town of Radville - Water Treatment Plant Upgrade. MRIF funding
